Music Notes



"O sing unto God with the voice of melody." -Psalm 47:1

Sing to the God of Israel was written by American composer Richard DeLong (1951-94). The text of this anthem is the Canticle of Deborah, found in Judges 5:1-5. Deborah was a prophetess and one of the judges who ruled over Israel in the years after the death of Joshua. She led the people of Israel in a mighty defeat of the army of the Canaanite King Jabin. After the defeat of the army of the Canaanites, Deborah sang this song to the Lord. Composer Richard DeLong received a Master of Sacred Music degree from Southern Methodist University, where his teachers included Dr. Robert Anderson. Dr. Anderson was St. James's organ consultant during the rebuilding after the 1994 fire and was instrumental in the selection of our CB Fisk pipe organ. DeLong was Director of Music for the Roman Catholic parish of St. Mark the Evangelist, in Plano, Texas, a position he held until his death.

Prayer for Holy Baptism is a piece that I composed in 1987 for the baptism of Elizabeth Jane Whitmire. The text is by Charles Wesley (1757-1834), the English priest who, with his brother John, began the evangelical movement that became Methodism. The melody of "Prayer for Holy Baptism" was inspired by the Latin chant Veni Sancte Spiritus, which was brought to mind by Wesley's words, "Come, Father, Son, and Holy Ghost, by blood, by water and by fire...seal our souls forever thine."

Wade in the water is an African-American spiritual arranged by Steven Calantropio. Like many spirituals, the words are a sort of code. Because any slave knew the secret meaning of these songs, they could be used to signal many things. For example, Harriet Tubman used Wade in the Water to tell escaping slaves to get off the trail and into the water to evade the dogs of their pursuers. People walking through water did not leave a scent trail that dogs could follow. Composer Steven Calantropio taught music and movement in the River Edge, NJ public schools for 31 years prior to his retirement in 2004.
