Music Notes



Wachet Auf is a setting by J. S. Bach (1685-1720) of the well-known Reformation chorale tune. The text is based in Jesus' words on a reading from the Gospel of Mark: "Keep awake, for you do not know when the master of the house will come."

O pray for the peace of Jerusalem is a setting of Psalm 22 is by the English composer Herbert Howells (1892-1978). Howells was a student of Stanford and Charles Wood at the Royal College of Music. In 1920 he began teaching composition at the RCM, where he continued until his eightieth birthday.

O Sapentia is from the seven "O Antiphons." The "O Antiphons" are prayers that come from the service of Vespers during the week before Christmas Eve. Each antiphon begins with "O" and addresses Jesus with a unique title which comes from the prophecies of Isaiah and Micah, and whose initials, when read backwards, form an acrostic for the Latin "Ero Cras" which means "Tomorrow I come."
