

**DANIEL BENJAMIN SAÑEZ** is Director of Music and Liturgy, Principal Organist, and Choirmaster for the Cathedral of the Sacred Heart in Richmond, where he leads liturgical celebrations for the parish and the Diocese of Richmond. Daniel is also Artistic Director of the *Music for a Cathedral Space Concert Series*.

Previous positions include Director of Music, Organist, and Choirmaster for the Church of Saint Catherine of Siena in New York City, Associate Director of Music for the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception, and Assistant Director of Music at Holy Trinity Church in Georgetown, DC.

A Hollywood, CA, native, Daniel has performed with the Los Angeles Master Chorale, L.A. Opera, Placido Domingo, Kronos Quartet, Richmond Symphony; and conductors Esa-Pekka Salonen, John Williams, Keith Lockhart, and Jeanette Sorrell. He has given concerts throughout North America and Europe; and has performed for His Holiness Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI; the Cardinals and Bishops of the United States; the President of the United States, and the United States Joint Chiefs of Staff.

A graduate of Boston College, Daniel received a Fulbright Fellowship, continuing organ studies at the famed *Thomaskirche*, where J.S. Bach served as music director. He earned the Master of Music in Historical Performance at the Oberlin College Conservatory of Music. Daniel is a member of the New York City and Richmond Chapters of the American Guild of Organists, the Conference of Roman Catholic Cathedral Musicians, Organ Historical Society, Church Music Association of America, American Choral Directors Association, and National Association of Pastoral Musicians.
