

“If You Came This Way . . .”:  
A Pilgrimage and hike to Farrar’s Island, Henrico, Virginia



Praying with the 1552 Book of Common Prayer as we worship in the recreated colonial church there, we'll explore how two kinsmen, William Farrar I of Farrar's Island and Nicholas Ferrar, Jr., of Little Gidding, both with grounding in the emerging Anglican theology, forged two different paths forward in building community in the seventeenth century English Atlantic world.

This pilgrimage includes a four-mile meditative walk through the Dutch Gap Conservation Area, where with poetry and prayer we will reflect with each footstep on God's kingdom, and how the land and James River have changed over the past 400 years in response to human activity.

Limited to 20 participants, all ages welcome. Admission fees can be paid day-of at Henricus Historical Park: Adults: \$8; Children (ages 3 - 12): \$7; Children (2 and under): Free; Members: Free (must present a Patron Pass or photo identification); Military: \$1 discount to active and retired military personnel and their families.
