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It All Starts With Registration

Registering your child online achieves two things: It helps you learn about our programs in a timely way and it helps us support you in the most complete way possible. children's ministry (birth to 5th grade)

Sunday School Open House - Sunday, September 18

On Sunday, September 18 from 10:15 am to 11:00 am, children and parents are invited to meet their Sunday school teachers and learn about the year to come.

Godly Play

This is a Sunday morning curriculum (from 10:15 am to 11:00 am) for young children (age 3–1st Grade) that engages them in Bible stories and liturgical actions. Volunteer Godly Play storytellers present stories and parables and encourage children to wonder and respond to their stories.

Growing in Faith

A Sunday morning program (from 10:15 am to 11:00 am) for children in 2nd–5th grades that uses a rotation model and a variety of modalities to engage children in Bible stories. Each lesson is presented for two or three weeks where the same story is looked at through the lenses of art, cooking, games, music, science and storytelling. This approach offers children multiple ways to connect to the Bible lesson.

Nursery

Throughout the program year our nursery is open on Sunday mornings from 8:30 am to 12:30 pm for infants through 4 year-olds.

Children's Chapel on Sundays

This is offered each Sunday at the 9:00 am service (during the sermon, prayers, and announcements) for children of all ages. It includes the Gospel reading, a brief children's sermon from our clergy, and favorite songs lead by Dr. Whitmire. Children's Chapel is best suited for children age 3–3rd grade.

Baptism

Baptisms are offered as part of Sunday morning worship service most months (except during Lent or Advent). Especially appropriate dates for Baptism are the Feast of the Baptism of our Lord (the first Sunday after Epiphany), Pentecost, and All Saints Day. Choirs for Children of Every Age

There are choirs for every age, pre-K through high school. In choir, every child is able to find his or her voice so they can enjoy a lifetime of singing. Children learn how to be active participants in worship. They also learn teamwork, build lifelong friendships and become a member of a vibrant and close-knit community.

- Cherub Choir (pre-K–2nd grades): Sings at the 9:00 am service. First rehearsal: Wednesday, September 14, 4:00 pm
- Children's Choir (3rd–5th grades): Sings at the 9:00 am service. First rehearsal: Wednesday, September 14, 5:00 pm
- Youth Choir (6th–12th grades): Sings at the 11:15 am service. First rehearsal: Sunday, September 11, 12:30 pm

The Youth Ministry at St. James's is so much more than just a "youth group." We nurture and engage 6th–12th graders, and their families, in all aspects of church and family life. Youth Ministry Fall Kick Off - Sunday, September 18

Youth and their parents are encouraged to gather together in-person for our Kick Off Event on Sunday, September 18 at 10:15 am in the Sanctuary to meet the youth leaders and learn about all the youth ministry offerings this year. We hope to see you there!

Sunday Youth Groups

We have two youth groups that meet most Sundays from 10:15 am to 11:00 am on the 3rd floor of the Michaux House. Time spent together in youth groups is all about relationships – with each other and with God. We'll play games, build friendships, and grow in our faith together through stories, video and discussions, and put our faith into action through service projects.

- Junior Youth Fellowship, JYF, for middle schoolers in grades 6–8
- Senior Youth Fellowship, SYF, for high schoolers in grades 9–12.

Summer Youth Missions

Mission experiences are a great way for youth and their adult leaders to put their faith into action. Missions allow youth to grow in relationship with God, others, and themselves. And, they are a ton of fun! In 2023, St. James's will offer a Mini-Mission with Harvest of Hope and the Appalachia Youth Mission.



Youth Confirmation

At St. James's we like to think of this religious milestone as "base camp" on your spiritual journey. It's neither your point of origin, nor your destination, but a place to rest, grow, and be equipped for your spiritual journey. Students, beginning in 9th grade, are eligible to participate accompanied by at least one parent. If 9th grade doesn't feel like a good fit, you're welcome to come back any time later in high school. Registration and detailed information for our youth confirmation process is now open and available on the church website for the for the 2022-2023 program year.
