If you're visiting St. James's today, let us begin by saying WELCOME. We're delighted you've decided to join us.

St. James's is a community drawn together by our love of God and our desire to serve Christ in the world. We pray together, work together, learn, laugh, and sing together. We are eager for you to join in our worship and fellowship today.

- There are restrooms downstairs from the narthex (the entrance to the church). The stairs are on the west side of the church.
- Sit where you like. There are no assigned seats.
- As for communion, if you receive communion in your home church, you're welcome to receive it at St. James's too. With some exceptions, we also offer Special Prayers and Blessings during communion. Just go to the Chapel to the left of the communion rail.
- Please fill out the Welcome Card in the pew. It will help us get to know you better.

Second Lesson: Luke 24:36b-48

"O sing unto God with the voice of melody." -Psalm 47:1

O be joyful in the Lord is a setting of Psalm 100 by the twentieth-century composer Benjamin Britten (1913-76). Britten employs a style which is not monophonic--as is a unison hymn, or polyphonic--as is a typical Renaissance motet, but heterophonic in style. Influenced by music of Asian folk instrumentalists, Britten developed a style in which the various parts sing almost, but not exactly, together. The small diversions of one part from the other, create mild dissonances which are not unlike the conflicting harmonics one hears in a steel drum, or in the St. James's chimes, for example.

Most glorious Lord of Life is by the 20th-century English composer William H. Harris (1893-1973). Harris became Assistant Organist at St David's Cathedral in Wales at age 14. He went on to serve at Lichfield Cathedral, Christ Church Oxford, and St. George's Chapel, Windsor.
