### **Boy Scout Troop 400**



Registering your child online achieves two things: It helps you learn about our programs in a timely way and it helps us support you in the most complete way possible. Our Children's Ministry is for children birth to 5th grade and our Youth Ministry is for 6th-12th grade teens.

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## Children's Ministry (birth to 5th grade)

#### Sunday School Open House - Sunday, September 15

On Sunday, September 15, from 10:15 am to 11:00 am, children and parents are invited to meet their Sunday school teachers and learn about the year to come.

### **Godly Play**

This is a Sunday morning curriculum (from 10:15 am to 11:00 am) for young children (age 3–1st grade) that engages them in Bible stories and liturgical actions. Volunteer Godly Play storytellers present stories and parables and encourage children to wonder and respond to their stories.

### **Growing in Faith**

A Sunday morning program (from 10:15 am to 11:00 am) for children in 2nd–5th grades that uses a rotation model and a variety of modalities to engage children in Bible stories. Each lesson is presented for two or three weeks where the same story is looked at through the lenses of art, cooking, games, music, science and storytelling. This approach offers children multiple ways to connect to the Bible lesson.

### **Nursery**

Throughout the program year, our nursery is open on Sunday mornings from 8:30 am to 12:30 pm for infants through 4 year-olds.

### Children's Chapel on Sundays

This is offered each Sunday at the 9:00 service (during the sermon and prayers). It includes the Gospel reading, a brief children's sermon from our clergy, and favorite songs lead by Dr. Whitmire. Children's Chapel is best suited for children age 3–3rd grade.

### **Baptism**

Baptisms are offered as part of Sunday morning worship service most months (except during Lent or Advent). Especially appropriate dates for Baptism are the Feast of the Baptism of our Lord (the first Sunday after Epiphany), Pentecost, and All Saints Day For information about Baptisms contact Ashlee Ligon at <a href="mailto:childrensministry@doers.org">childrensministry@doers.org</a>.

## **Choirs for Children of Every Age**

There are choirs for every age, pre-K through high school. In choir, every child is able to find his or her voice so they can enjoy a lifetime of singing. Children learn how to be active participants in worship. They also learn teamwork, build lifelong friendships and become a member of a vibrant and close-knit community.

- Youth Choir (6th–12th grades): Sings at the 11:15 am service. First rehearsal: Sunday, September 8, 12:30 pm

## Youth Ministry (6th to 12th grade)

The Youth Ministry at St. James's is so much more than just a "youth group." We nurture and engage 6th–12th graders, and their families, in all aspects of church and family life. We're kicking off with donuts, games and ice breakers on Sunday, September 15, at 10:15 am. Middle school youth should go to Room 304 of Michaux House and high school youth to Room 302. Parents are welcome to stop by to grab our calendar and ask questions.

## **Sunday Youth Groups**

We have two youth groups that meet most Sundays. Depending on the week, we may meet in the morning or at night, spend time inside or outside, discuss our faith or just socialize together. Come out and try the many different ways you can participate in youth group! Time spent together in youth groups is all about relationships – with each other and with God. We'll play games, build friendships, and grow in our faith together through stories and discussions, and put our faith into action through service projects.

- Junior Youth Fellowship, JYF, for middle schoolers in grades 6–8. Meets in Room 304 in Michaux House.
- Senior Youth Fellowship, SYF, for high schoolers in grades 9–12. Meets in Room 302 in Michaux House.
- New this year! Second Sunday Socials. Each month we will meet somewhere fun at night. Examples include Triangle Rock Club, laser tag and roller skating!

#### **Overnight Retreats and Lock-Ins**

Retreats and lock-ins are a wonderful way to spend time together, do something new, and reflect on your journey with God. Our MLK Service Lock-in for grades 9-12 and Snowfest for grades 6-12 are two ways you can disconnect and spend time with your St. James's community.

#### **Summer Youth Missions**

Mission experiences are a great way for youth and their adult leaders to be "doers of the word." Missions allow youth to grow in relationship with God, others, and themselves. And, they are a ton of fun! In 2025, St. James's will offer a Middle School Mission with Harvest of Hope and the High School Appalachia Mission.



#### Confirmation

At St. James's we like to think of this religious milestone as "base camp" on your spiritual journey. It's neither your point of origin, nor your destination, but a place to rest, grow, and be equipped for your spiritual journey. Students, beginning in 9th grade, are eligible to participate. If 9th grade doesn't feel like a good fit, you're welcome to come back any time later in high school.
