BLAKE SINGER (BSINGER@DOERS.ORG) Last year, St. James's Mission Committee began discerning a relationship with the Episcopal Church in Navajoland. A small group took an exploratory trip to prayerfully consider what possibilities existed. In accordance with the Mission Committee's new vision and guiding principles, the next step in this discernment is to lead a pilgrimage to further explore and pursue this relationship. However, we will be using the phrase "Spiritual Journey" rather than "pilgrimage," due to the complex history between indigenous people and colonialism.

This trip will be like a traditional pilgrimage insofar as we hope you will go deeper spiritually and in your life in Christ by encountering Jesus in a new, beautiful, and unfamiliar place while coming to terms with the complexities around indigenous history in America. It is unlike a traditional pilgrimage insofar as we hope that the relationship with the Episcopal Church in Navajoland and people there will continue well beyond the initial pilgrimage and will hopefully lead to new opportunities for mutual ministry in the future.

Rev. Paula serves as a priest in Montezuma Creek, UT. Using the skills learned from various training and classes throughout her life has supported Paula's ministry with the Episcopal Church of Navajoland as assigned. Rev. Paula started a craft group with local elders in the community where they join in fellowship and create stunning traditional rug weavings and other crafts. Paula finds her community nourishing and fulfilling. She greets the people with clanship and loves to listen to their stories which are rich in history.

Rev. Blake Singer will also be along for the ride, but as a fellow journier rather than an official leader.
